The Session met on July 17, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. in the Session Room and took the following action:

- The Mission Study Review Committee joined the Session to give an update and seek approval of the Mission Study Report which was unanimously approved. Once the Commission on Ministry with the Presbytery approves the report, they will allow us to hold a congregational meeting to elect the members of the Pastor Nominating Committee.
- The Admin Committee reported that they were looking into options for investing designated funds to attempt to allow that money to grow. The committee also reported that we have a budget surplus for 2018 but we must remember that we are not fully staffed at the present time.
- Christian Ed reported that we had 11 youth participate in Gatekeepers and 17 youth attend
 Montreat. The committee is looking toward
 Rally Day and planning for next year.
- The Property Committee reported that the bus is in the shop again and that soon the Session will need to make a decision regarding the future of the bus. Property is waiting on final bids for an alarm system for the church.
- Approved the use of the church for the wedding rehearsal and wedding of Jessica Herndon and Kevin Johnson on August 9-10, 2019.
- Approved request by Rocky Mount Garden Club to use the fellowship hall for a yard sale on October 6, 2018 and setup on October 5, 2018.



Dear Church family,

It is with a very overflowing heart that I am finally finding the words to express how much you have all meant to our family. Our lives were unexpectedly turned upside down last February 2nd; no one could ever prepare for that. Young people are not supposed to get cancer. We have struggled with "why" for so long. Logan is in his senior year at UNC, has always worked extremely hard in school and his job, and has always been such a good person. His whole life had to be put on hold, and it has been hard watching his friends graduate and move on. It has been an extremely scary, emotional, frustrating, and overwhelming journey so far; having a serious illness is a full time job. Our journey started with his diagnosis, then immediately moved to inpatient chemotherapy at Duke every 2 weeks. His tumor is in his pelvic bone and was not operable, and we were advised to explore proton radiation, which is not available in our state. We were able to live in Philadelphia for 7 weeks in an apartment donated by an incredible organization called Ella's Retreat. Our apartment was located in Center City between Love Park and "Logan" Square if you can believe. I believe that was a sign. Logan received radiation 5 days a week and still continued chemo while there; his bone marrow was hit hard by the combination, and he had 3 blood transfusions and 2 platelet infusions while there. We were extremely fortunate to be able to pull off this crucial treatment for Logan. He has been home a little over a month now, and is continuing at Duke with chemo, with 2 more admissions left, hopefully finishing in early September.

I have personally never experienced the love, kindness, generosity, and enormity of caring since this has happened to Logan. Honestly, I have struggled so long with how to put our gratitude into words. Right after he was diagnosed, a pumpkin pie appeared at our door just because Sydney remembered how much Logan loved pumpkin pie from Montreat many years before, and I had just been thinking about making him one five minutes earlier. Who remembers stuff like that? I will admit, I had to cry a little over that one. Since then, outpourings of cards, gift cards, food, prayers, and monetary donations have arrived at our house. Medical bills are enormous, and I have missed so much work that I have lost count. Please know that each and every single prayer and contribution has been cherished, appreciated, and put away for good use towards Logan's treatment and keeping our family afloat.

I have said this a lot recently, and it bears repeating again. With all of the bad things happening in this world, it is amazing to see the pure goodness in humanity when it pulls together. Thank you from the bottom of my heart First Presbyterian Church.


