All Saints

According to <u>Lives of the Saints</u> ed. Rev. Hugo Hoever, S.O.Cist., PhD, every day of the year except Christmas, and some days during Holy Week, celebrate at least one Catholic saint. The Orthodox church and Coptic church have a different list of saints to honor. Some protestant denominations also recognize and honor saints. The practice of honoring martyrs and those prominent Christians who had passed away was an early occurrence. Each church and area had their own celebrations of local saints in early Christianity. It wasn't until later that the church began canonizing saints and assigning days of celebration. Soon, however, there were more saints to celebrate than days in the year. So, "All Saints Day" was designated to celebrate all those Saints that didn't have a day to celebrate.

All "Hollows Eve" became a Celtic celebration in which the dead Saints were thought to have one evening to walk the earth again. You can take it from there to understand our present celebration of Halloween.

Our protestant understanding is that all those who confess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are saints whether living or dead. But I think it is important to ask the question: "Who are the heroes of the faith?" Who were the Christian influences in your life? This is what it truly means to be a saint whether canonized or not. So, happy November 1 to all you saints of the Lord!

Forty-five members of our church enjoyed a delicious lunch while listening to Lori Fees, Development Officer and Church Liaison of Children's Hope Alliance as she discussed the many wonderful programs and specialists that work with the children there. She showed a video about children who told of their lives before and after Children's Hope Alliance. Lori thanked our church for its continuing financial support and asked that we continue to pray for the children, staff, and the programs that are offered there. Over \$800 was given to Lori at the luncheon.









The Session met on October 16, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. in the Session Room and took the following action:

- A recommendation from the Outreach Committee to approve a gift of \$2000 to Conetoe Family Life Center for repairs to their van. The funds will come from the mission tithe.
- The allocation of the peacemaking offering collected on World Communion Sunday to Peacemakers of Rocky Mount was approved.
- Scott Solether's contract which was set to expire November 1, 2018 was extended for an additional 6 month period under the same terms with the exception of removing the \$4000 moving expenses allocated in his initial contract and adding an allocating that \$4000 to Continuing Education and Self Paid Medical Expenses for family. In the event we call a new minister, we can terminate the contract by giving Scott 30 days notice. If the contract has less than 60 days remaining on the contract, then we will pay the remainder of the contract. If the contract has more than 60 days remaining then we will pay Scott his compensation package for 60 days. (These terms are pursuant to the Presbytery's interim pastor agreement).
- A motion to sell the church bus for \$10,000 carried unanimously. The Session will investigate options regarding the costs for either renting vans when needed or using the funds to purchase another van/bus for church use. We will be looking at whether having to rent a van each time we need something will be more or less expensive as well as where we will store anything that we buy to prevent vandalism.

We welcome your input on this and all other matters.
