

## CHILDREN AND YOUTH UPDATE

### **Children**

"When he saw all the people, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless—they seemed to Jesus like sheep without a shepherd." Matthew 9:36

In this new year, the focus for the children's ministry will continue to be prayer in action. We will continue to meet together in Sunday school and Parents' Afternoon Out with the intent of helping our children grow into a spiritual world of their own rich with stories, religious language, and models of prayer. We are setting the stage for deepening spirituality. We will focus on the actions of our faith in this half of our church year by learning about compassion and using Jesus as our model.

Parents, these are the Bible stories that will carry us through this season of ordinary time, through Lent, and into the Easter season. Please read them and talk about them with your children at home. Also make prayer a family habit. Pray at meals, pray at bedtime, or pray any time you remember! The most important part of modeling prayer in action for your children is to do this spiritual practice together.

Matthew 9:35-38 Christ is our shepherd and takes time to have compassion by noticing us.

Mark 10:17-27 God has compassion for us even when we struggle to follow God's will for us.

Luke 7:11-17 We can practice empathy in interacting with others, just like Jesus.

**John 5:1-9** We are called to compassion, even if others say it's the wrong thing to do. God's voice guides us above all others.

#### Youth

Last fall at youth group, we began to learn about keeping God's time and about Sabbath rest. We looked at "God's time" by exploring the Christian calendar and comparing it to the youth's busy calendars that include school, sports and extracurriculars, studying, work and more. We asked the questions, "How many calendars do you keep?" and next, "How do we bring God's promised future into our present?" We all agreed worship is our opportunity to bring God's kingdom into reality each week. Next we talked about the meaning of Sabbath and took the time to practice Sabbath rest. We tried to answer this question: "How do you think that practicing Sabbath rest might challenge the way we currently live our lives?" This winter, the Christian Education Committee would like to invite you to examine your family's calendars. We would like to challenge you to make God's time your family's priority. This will look different for different families, but we do hope that prioritizing God's time and making Sabbath rest a family habit will bring you back to the place where we experience God's kingdom each week when we gather to worship. We challenge you to sit down with your youth and choose at least two dates each month that he or she, or your whole family, can attend worship or another youth group event.

Here is a prayer for your family to use when you sit down to look at your calendars together:

"O God, giver of all good gifts, we give you thanks for the gift of time. Though you are beyond time, you blessed and fulfilled time by entering into it through none other than our Lord Jesus Christ. By your Spirit, help me to live as if time belongs to you alone and to receive each day with gratitude and hopeful expectation." Amen. (Holy Things for Youth Ministry, Hardesty-Crouch & Edie).
