It is an opportunity to experience worship in a different way. The plans for that Sunday are still in the works, but it will look something like this: We will meet in the fellowship hall at 10:00 AM on that Sunday; it will begin with fellowship for all including brunch; worship will take place at the tables; we will sing, pray, hear God's word and discuss what we can do and be to become an Inviting Church as well as a Welcoming Church. They may follow closely with our regular service or

be a little different. "Don't Panic!" (From The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy) This is not an attempt to get rid of or replace the traditional service of this church with a "contemporary" one. I hope you come with an open mind, excitement about your church, and a desire for sharing the good news of God's gracious love to a hurting world. You should be expecting a call in the near future from an Elder or
