We all struggle to believe everything all the time. In fact, a little skepticism is a very good thing in most of life. We all sin and fall short of God's glory. We are all in need of perpetual grace. Rather than doubt or sin, the opposite of faith is apathy, quitting.

As we move forward with yet another step toward a more open and traditional worship service, I want to thank all the people who kept the faith by staying engaged. Digital worship is NOT the same as being here in person. Rotations and reservation lists are miserable for those organizing them and applying to them. Designated seating can force us to be in part of the building that we find less worshipful. Nevertheless, many of you remain engaged! You kept the faith! Thank you!!!

There were things that we tried that utterly failed (hybrid classes). There were things that succeeded despite our skepticism to the contrary (outdoor children's Christmas service). There have been unexpected benefits to digital worship (returning members), and there have been unanticipated setbacks along the way.

Our church never gave up. You never gave up. Together, we kept trying, evolving, shifting, and growing toward the new future that God is already creating in our midst. Right now, our efforts mandate 2 services; only God knows what it will look like next. We won't stop listening, learning, growing, trying, failing, and ultimately succeeding. We will keep the faith!

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION UPDATE

Pre-K Kids

Elementary Age Kids

Session unanimously approved our next step toward traditional 4th, we will offer two worship services on Sunday mornings.

worship. Beginning on Easter, April

We will offer a 9:45am service for non-vaccinated families and an 11:00am service for vaccinated families (2 weeks post final shot). We will also continue to offer a livestream of the 11am service. No reservations are needed for either service; we only ask for a measure of patience as we work through any hiccups that may arise.

We will also be returning to live, sung music. Solos and duets will be offered by our choral scholars, and "soft" congregational singing will be encouraged.

For safety, there will continue to be 6 ft. spacing for the 9:45 service and 3 ft. spacing for the 11:00 service. Masks will still be required by all who join us in worship, no matter which service. We will also keep up to date on any changes in the recommendations from scientists and denominational leadership and respond as necessary.



The Maundy Thursday worship service will be a collaborative effort with our fellow Rocky Mount Presbyterians. The service will be on Zoom at 7pm on April 1st. We will be worshipping alongside others in our community with prerecorded music, real-time scripture readings, and a celebration of the Lord's Supper. A Zoom link will be sent for you to be able to tune in and join with us in a time of worship.
