A Prayer for September

Dear God,

September feels like January, in a "New Year" sort of way. A time for new beginnings, second chances, and celebration. God, we pray for the students. Chancel Choir looking for new members...

If you've thought about singing in the choir, now is a good time to put thought into action. If you've not thought about it, please think about it!

You don't have to audition and you don't have to already know how to read music. Although it's an important skill to learn if you're going to stick with singing for a long time, it is by no means required when you start. Even singers who have been performing for years may not know how to read music. In the choir, you can learn the songs by listening and repeating.

The activity of singing is a wonderful workout for the lungs. The actions of breathing deeply and opening the diaphragm help to oxygenate the blood, creating more white blood cells, which strengthens the whole body. The breathing rate slows and deepens, releasing endorphins and increasing a sense of well-being. Singing improves your posture and tones your stomach muscles. A strong core supports the spine so your body will be less prone to injury as you age.

Music is a strong emotional force. Choir rehearsal may become your favorite part of the week. It is an opportunity to escape your daily stresses and responsibility for a few hours and focus on creating something beautiful.

Choir contributes to the understanding of God and the experience of worship.

Choir gives us the opportunity to be worship leaders.

Choir fulfills the Biblical admonishment to "sing to our God."

Choir focuses on DOING rather than OBSERVING.

Choir allows praise with body, mind, spirit, and voice.

Choir helps develop concepts of teamwork and cooperation.

Choir is a gift that will last a lifetime.

- The weekly email update is sent out via Constant Contact on Wednesday afternoon. The deadline for information is noon on Wednesday.




The love and sympathy of the congregation is extended to Sue Jackson and family upon the death of her husband Gene Jackson on August 28, 2021.
