A NOTE FROM OUR COMMUNITY PASTOR

Soul Care


Over the past week, I was at a conference on Sabbath rest. Not necessarily the kind of rest that involves naps and sleeping in, though I personally am not a nap-hater. Sabbath rest is the kind of rest that is restorative to the spirit, and a spirit is restored when it is filled physically, emotionally, mentally, relationally, and spiritually, producing fulfillment, joy, passion, and rest. Now, the purpose of this specific conference is to fight clergy burnout, which has historically always been high and is currently at astronomical levels. But as I was sitting through the conference and realizing how much it was speaking to me, I also thought about my church and community—the whole world even—where teachers are burnt out and doctors and nurses are burnt out and leaders are burnt out and family caregivers are burnt out—volunteers, those in the service industry, retail people—weariness levels are high all around us, in each of us, at different times and for different reasons, but there nonetheless.

And here's the unfortunate thing: we can't really fix it, at least not externally. We can't fix Covid or bring 700,000 people back to life so the work force is operating in full again, and we can't erase the collective trauma of the past 2 years without intentional work at healing. So it weighs on our spirits in ways we recognize or don't. And we push through life at 110 percent, trying to meet expectations and meet all responsibilities, and then we tack soul care on top of it, if we tack it on at all. So we are tired, and our souls remain splintered.

We can't fix this exhaustion externally, but we can navigate it internally, and ultimately, the question we are all individually responsible for is: how can I heal my spirit? As you think on that, here are some questions to consider:

- What relationships in my life make me feel whole, loved, accepted?
- What physical activity makes my muscles feel alive and my heart pump with joy? What pulls me out of my head and centers me in my body?
- How am I practicing creativity regularly in my life? (Note: this is not necessarily drawing, painting, photography, writing—creativity is simply taking action on imagination)
- What questions about God and the Universe am I nursing, and how can I engage them more intentionally?
- What can I set down so my soul feels lighter?

I firmly believe that God loves us and calls us good and wants us to live full and joyful lives. But I'm learning that fullness and space look mighty similar. If you're interested in going on a soul journey with me, I'd love to grab coffee and chat. We are each others' keeper, after all, and I'd love to walk alongside you, and have you alongside me.

Stewardship season is upon us! Each pledge is a blessing to the church as we seek to be faithful stewards of the resources God has entrusted to us. First Presbyterian Church offers the below options for making your contribution:

- Bank draft This is a safe and steady way to consistently support First Presbyterian Church. It can be selected on your pledge card and attaching a voided check. The monthly bank draft occurs on the 25th of each month. If the 25th falls on a weekend or holiday, it is drafted on the next business day. If you currently have a bank draft and want to continue, this can be indicated on your pledge card. The draft for your 2022 contribution would begin January 25th 2022. If you choose the bank draft, you can also stop it by contacting Jeanne Shannon in the church office 2 weeks before the 25th of any month.
- Envelopes these can be ordered by marking this option on your pledge card
- Sale of stock Schwab online does not include the church member name in the trade details. If using this method, please contact Jeanne Shannon with the details or ask your broker contact Jeanne in the church office. The stock sale process should begin in early November to allow time for the process (2 weeks from initial trade date to receiving the check) and to make the 12/31 deadline due to holidays.
- Loose checks in the Sunday collection or checks placed in Jeanne Shannon's mailbox All checks will be applied to your pledge unless indicated otherwise in the 'memo' line.
- Online giving Sow the seeds for the future with online giving today! This is an easy and convenient way to give your tithes using a debit or credit card or electronic funds transfer. The service through PayPal is easily accessed through the church website. You can rest easy knowing that the transaction is safe and secure, and your gift will be available to our ministry immediately, with no waiting periods. - The weekly email update is sent out via Constant Contact on Wednesday afternoon. The deadline for information is noon on Wednesday.




