A NOTE FROM OUR COMMUNITY PASTOR

The older I get, the more I question about my faith. Once upon a time a found myself threatened by these questions, desperate to silence them lest the answer I found tear everything apart. At one point, I thought if I could arm myself with knowledge about my faith, I could intellectualize myself around any obstacle that floated my way. I was holding onto it so tightly, with such desperation, that it started to hurt, and I wanted to let go completely.

That's when I settled on "God is love." That truth is the only certainty I need and the closest to certain I get with my faith. My call as someone who believes this, then, is to live it out as if it is true. If God is love, than wherever love shows itself in the world is God—loving our partners, children, friends; showing love to strangers in dignity and grace; loving the planet by picking up trash or appreciating the sunrise; accepting the love of others, of our pet; loving ourselves—believing that everyone we see is worthy of love as they are, that we are worthy of love as we are—no ifs, ands, or buts. This is as simple as it gets. It's simple, but it's so powerful.

The second part of my call as a person of faith, is to also ask the questions my heart wrestles with—to practice my spiritual curiosity, to respect scripture by interrogating with gentle intention, to voice my questions and sit in them, to break down the binary of black and white and sit in the gray area. My call is to hold on to my faith, to live it out, and to grow in it by exploring it. This is ultimately why I wanted to be a pastor!

As we prepare for the Lenten season, which is one of faithful intentionality, I'm curious to know what your core convictions of faith are—faith in its simplest, most profound, articulation (i.e. God is love). I'd also love to hear what questions, curiosities, or doubts are making your faith dance right now? If you're comfortable, shoot me an email—or maybe we could grab a cup of coffee.

In the meantime, know that I believe this: God is love and you are loved. There is nothing you can do or think or be that makes that any less true, and I pray that you are able to feel that in your bones, especially during these cold winter months when we need something to warm us after the sun sets.
