Covid-19 Update Effective February 23, 2022

Effective on February 23, 2022 by the guidance of the Session, masks are no longer required for vaccinated individuals when in the church building or during worship. SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE SUPPER

Mark your calendars for a fun tradition here at First Presbyterian!





Shrove Tuesday—the celebration before the fast—is the day before Lent begins. The name Shrove Tuesday comes from the custom of ringing the "shriving bell" to summon people to church to be "shriven," that is, to confess their sins at the beginning of Lent. At that time, certain foods were given up for the duration of Lent (i.e. eggs, milk, meat, and rich buttery dishes). Pancakes offered an easy solution and in England, Shrove Tuesday was called Pancake Day! Another name for Shrove Tuesday is Mardi Gras, which translates to "Fat Tuesday" in French.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is always 46 days before Easter Sunday. Its official name is "Day of Ashes," so called because of the practice of rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the sign of the cross.

Lent is a 40 day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebrations. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focusing on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice and resurrection.
