Let me tell you a little bit more about the Lucas Project.

The Lucas family is going through Peacemaker's holistic financial training program and are currently living in a rental home. They are about to become first-time homeowners after a period of home-lessness and move into a house that was donated to Peacemakers. Our church, along with other local churches, has partnered with Peacemakers to help fix up this home to be the absolute best it can be for the new homeowners.

Over the course of two weekends in March we landscaped the front yard, trimmed trees, removed cacti and other bushes, demolished a kitchen, removed old carpet, and prepared the house to be renovated and renewed. The Lucas family will be purchasing an amazing home from Peacemakers, and the fingerprints of First Presbyterian Church are all over that new home.

One other aspect of this project is a financial commitment to Peacemakers, the Lucas Project, and South Rocky Mount. Session has pledged \$20,000 to the Lucas Project to help renovate this home and make it a bright spot in our community. When the Lucas' purchase their home, that money will be reinvested into more homes and refurbishments in South Rocky Mount, which we hope to be able to help refurbish and renew with sweat equity and more weekend work days.

This one time financial commitment is a down payment for a cleaner, safer, and more lovely South Rocky Mount with homeownership, financial stewardship, and changed lives.

If you were a part of one of our work days, share how much fun you had with our church family and neighbors. If you are able, please begin to think about how you might be able to help us meet our \$20,000 pledge to Peacemakers and South Rocky Mount. There will be more information about how to do this coming out in the next few weeks.

Finally, I offer my thanks to everyone who helped to make this happen, whether it was providing snacks, lending your labor, or investing your money in this project. This great ministry of First Presbyterian Church is truly making a difference in our community.

A NOTE FROM OUR COMMUNITY PASTOR

Over the past month, approximately fifty members of FPC have been on the grounds of the Lucas Project. In our landscaping, demolition, and paint-prepping—we have been hard at work, in partnership with Peacemakers, First Baptist, and First Methodist, to transform this house into a home for Thomas and Tamara Lucas. It has been an energy-filled, generosity-driven month, and when the world asks what relevance the church has in our society anymore, I think of projects like this that make a real difference in real people's lives.

But even more amazing is the fact that this project is part of a much bigger initiative Peacemakers is undertaking to transform the face of poverty in South Rocky Mount. By improving and expanding the quality of housing and increasing the overall homeowner percentage in South Rocky Mount, without displacing any of the neighbors or overshadowing the culture of the neighborhood, Peacemakers is aiming to create a ladder out of poverty for the residents of South Rocky Mount so that their lives and their children's lives might flourish. So, in a nutshell, here are a few reasons why the success of this project is so important:

- 1. Currently, 48 percent of the residents of South Rocky Mount live at or below the poverty line, with 32 percent of all households in South Rocky Mount making less than \$15,000 a year. This reality is intimately intertwined with hunger and lack of access to nutritious foods, with health care problems and medical debt, with lackluster transportation, and an increased need to take on debt of all kinds. In the United States, only 8 percent of children born into the bottom 20 percent of income distribution are able to climb to the top 20 percent in adulthood. This means that poverty is a generational problem. Homeownership is the most accessible way to build wealth as a way out of poverty, and when paired with career readiness and educational opportunity, Peacemakers other two foci, the chances are much higher. This initiative is a doorway into a different life for the homeowners AND their children and grandchildren.
- 2. Currently there is a 40 percent homeownership rate in South Rocky Mount. It takes about a 70 percent homeownership rate for businesses to see an area as being economically viable for a sustainable business model. This means that when businesses are determining where to open, they are less likely to move to areas of town with low homeownership rates. By increasing homeownership rates in South Rocky Mount, Peacemakers is participating in the economic viability of our entire city by creating a neighborhood where businesses—and therefore jobs—can be sustained.
- 3. Many models of charity are well-meaning but ultimately cause harm. Such models involve temporary fixes that address the symptoms of an issue rather than the root causes. For example, there are seven food pantries in the neighborhood around Peacemakers. These food pantries are effective in keeping people from being hungry, but, week after week, the same people have to return to the pantry because the symptom of hunger is being addressed but not the causes of not being able to afford food. Sometimes short-term fixes are needed, but to offer them as the only fix is a disservice to the humanity and autonomy of those in need. Through this housing initiative Peacemakers is empowering its participants to take control of their own lives. Each person is going through a seven-month homeownership class where they learn how to buy and maintain a home, how to manage finances, and where they participate themselves in the renovation of their home and the homes of others in the program.

Our congregation's support of this program in our prayer, labor, and finances is our vote for a different, freer, and more empowered future for our neighbors in South Rocky Mount and our community as a whole. We thank you for your work and excitement thus far and invite you to consider how you might contribute toward our \$20,000 commitment to ensuring that the longevity of this initiative and its success over the next 20 years is made possible.
