Walking in the Light

We are in the season of the church year called Epiphany. In the world around us, it is cold and gloomy, but in worship it is the season of the coming of the Light, when we see all things shining and illumined by the light of Christ. It is also a season when we focus on discipleship, both on what it means to be called by Jesus and what it takes to follow him. One way to think about following Jesus is to talk about walking in the light. Imagine walking through the woods on a dark night, with only the light of your flashlight to help you see. Jesus is that light for our lives in a dark and complicated world.

It's not always easy to see absolutely clearly even in Jesus' light. Sometimes we put our foot wrong and make a mistake. Sometimes we go down the wrong path for a while. It's helpful to have a guide along the way. Over the next month in worship at Tree of Life, we'll be taking a look at a part of that guide – the Sermon on the Mount. The Sermon on the Mount is the largest collection we have of things Jesus taught. It's found in Matthew's gospel, chapters 5-7. Through these words, we learn what Jesus thought was important to teach his followers about how to follow God and walk in God's light. They aren't easy teachings. They include some things we'd rather not hear, like the direction to love our enemies. But they are as close as we get to Jesus' own teachings about how to love the Lord our God with all our heart and mind and strength and to love our neighbors as ourselves. It's worth paying attention. And remember - they begin with words, not of finger-wagging or judgment, but of blessing. Through these words, Jesus guides us on the way as we try to walk in the Light day by day.

We're excited to share what we've learned from you and other congregations!"

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation and Corporation of Tree of Life Church PCUSA will be held following worship on Sunday, February 9 in Boggs Hall. In this meeting, we will receive reports of the teams of the church, review financial reports, approve the pastor's terms of call for the coming year and elect officers of the corporation. Attending the meeting is a great way to understand the details of our church life and to participate in decision making as a member. Session Notes – January

Following are highlights of the January 8 Session meeting.

Report of the Clerk: Minutes of the Session meeting of Wednesday, December 6 were reviewed and received as presented.

Report of the Treasurer: December income totaled \$15,774 while expense totaled \$17,930 for a net current month deficit of \$2,155. Total income for 2019 totaled \$172, 972 while total expense totaled \$170,530 for a net surplus of \$2,5442.

Team Reports: Most teams did not meet in December.

• **Building Community** is planning for the Souper Bowl of Caring, which will take place on Saturday, February 1. They will soon begin to plan for Our Community Cup's "Share the Love Fest" which is scheduled for Saturday, February 15.

Nurture Faith team received positive response to Advent and Christmas programs. It was decided that providing for fellowship hour should no longer be a function of this team.

Report of the Pastor: Plans were finalized for coverage during the Pastor's study leave.

Report from the Larger Church: Carolyn Jeffrey will represent Tree of Life at the next general meeting of Presbytery on January 21 at Wayne Presbyterian Church.

Other Business: It was suggested that we reach out in an attempt to find other churches that might be willing to partner with us in supporting the coffee house. The need for additional volunteers continues to grow along with the growth of attendance on Friday evenings.
