

True confession time: I've always wanted to start a band named Lent. We'd only tour for 40 days per year and every night when we went on stage, we'd have the arena announcers yell, "Give it up for Lent!" (You'd think that joke would get old, but I've told it for years and still chuckle every time.)

We have a tradition in the church of giving things up for Lent – of depriving ourselves something for the forty days of Lent remembering the struggles Jesus faced as he neared his death on the cross. Often, this "giving up" involves food or soda or some sort of bad habit we've acquired that we'd like to shed. For many it's a second crack at an already-failed New Year's resolution.

But this practice of giving up is something a bit deeper. What we do in Lent is deny ourselves something that has taken up a lot of time and space in our lives so that we can create more room for God.

Lent is not about less of us, rather it's about more of God.

This season of Lent is an invitation to return to God. In the church, we have a 50-point word for this called "repentance," which simply means to turn and go in a new direction. Lent is a season of looking at the path we're on and asking hard questions about how we wander from God and doing what we can – establishing faith practices or habits – to close that gap that grows between us and God.

Lent is a season where we often come up against hard truths about our lives and our world. It's a time to look straight into the suffering and death that happens in our world knowing that God has overcome. It's about looking at those things that take us away from God, or that distract us from our faith, so that we can connect to God more fully.

It's nothing less than a journey to the foot of the cross.

But it's also a season of transformation, a season of change. It's a season where we hear stories of Jesus changing the lives of the people he meets as he does ministry in Galilee and beyond. We hear stories of the lives he touched through healing and miraculous encounters, as well as the everyday blessings of walking with and teaching his disciples God's desire for our world.

So this season, if you choose to give something up, I say that's great. If you choose not to, that's okay too. But my hope is that we may all look for ways to carve out more time and space in our lives for God to reign: more love, more grace, more mercy. We need it. Our world needs it. And maybe, just maybe, we might see our hearts and our lives transformed by our incredible God.
