For this first service we will not offer Communion. As we figure out the logistics on how to offer Communion safely, we will add it back in. More details to come as we get closer to the date. Although this will be significantly different than what we are used to, we are approaching this as a fun way to start worshiping together while still keeping everyone safe. "to live among God's faithful people..."

When things are going crazy in the world or in my life, one of the things that helps me center myself or re-focus is a sort of "back to basics" approach. This is true for physical health - have I drank enough water? gotten enough sleep? gotten some exercise? It's also true for our spiritual health as well.

One of those re-focusing lines for me is the promises we make when we affirm our baptism.

The first of these promises is that we promise to live among God's faithful people.

This has been particularly helpful for me lately because - I don't know about you - but I see things on the news or I see people posting things on social media and I think "Oh man I'm glad I'm not like *that* person" or "I'm glad I have it more together than they do." But the truth of the matter is that by thinking that, I'm creating division in my heart.

When we think these thoughts or ones similar, we're no longer living *among* God's faithful people, but we're attempting to live over them or above them or greater than them. We lose our sense of humility and pride threatens to overtake us.

The second part that sticks out to me is the word "faithful." When we promise to live *among*, it's a reminder to humble ourselves. When we speak the word faithful about others, it elevates those around us as well.

It reminds us that those people who think differently than us are also faithful children of God trying to live and serve to the best of their abilities.

Glennon Doyle has a great line in her book *Carry On, Warrior* that has stuck with me and reminded me of this truth time and again. She says,

"Be confident because you are a child of God. Be humble because so is everyone else."

Living among God's faithful people means remembering God has called us and claimed us in baptism. It's a call to both confidence and humility, boldness and meekness.

So in this time of pandemics and protests, may we lean into this promise to live among God's faithful people - to embrace this time of boldly proclaiming God's love and faithfulness to all.
