"Be still and know that I am God" - Psalm 46:10

When we think of spiritual practices of slowing down and focusing our time and attention on God's presence in our lives and in the world, a good place to start is with scripture. It can be difficult to know where to start when it comes to connecting with different parts of scripture, but a great place to start is the Psalms. The Psalms are basically the ancient hymnal of the church. There are Psalms with different themes: thanksgiving, lament, supplication, and trust.

One of my favorite Psalms to begin this work is Psalm 46. It's a song of trust in God no matter what may come. It's a reminder to us in a tumultuous time to be still and listen to the voice of God, still speaking in our midst.

So today, I'd invite you to take a little bit of time and read through it.

Don't skim it. Don't skip over it. Take a deep breath. Relax your shoulders. And read these wonderful promises that God reminds us of in this Psalm.

Psalm 46

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. Selah

There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved. God will help when the morning dawns. The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Selah

Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth. He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.

"Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth."

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

In the days of stillness and slowing down, may we remember that God is, indeed, our refuge and strength; a very present help in trouble.

I pray that this Psalm blesses you as it has blessed me, and that you are able to find some peace, rest, and respite in these days.
