For Lily's 6th birthday last July, we asked her what she wanted as a gift for her birthday. Immediately she said, "A unicorn." We said, "Well, do you have a backup?" She said, "A castle." We asked, "Does your backup have a backup?"

I thought about this again as we are coming up on our annual meeting and thinking about the things we bring to God and ask of God.

In Mark's gospel, as Jesus is entering Jerusalem for the Passover, he says this: "Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it and it will be yours."

Whatever you ask in prayer, believe that it is already yours. Begin to transform your mind, Jesus tells us, so that you see your life as already having that which you seek.

It may not bring a 6-year-old a unicorn or a castle. But I think it could help us with some of the things we bring to God.

One of the traps the Church tends to fall into is that we become so practical that we forget to imagine or dream the things that God could do with us.

I love hanging out with little kids because they don't have that pragmatic filter yet. You ask them what they want, they'll beg for things that don't even exist yet.

I wonder what it would look like if we approached our ministry and our life together in 2021 through the eyes of a child.

If you could ask anything of God for this church, what would it be?

Think big. Think bigger. Think beyond budgets and spreadsheets. Think beyond worship attendance and committees. Those things are all important, but they are intended to be a means by which we do ministry, not the ends of the ministry themselves.

What could God do here?

What would happen if we allowed our imaginations to go wild with the possibility of what God could do in this place?

In the letter to the Ephesians, we hear these words: "I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, will give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation that makes God known to you. I pray that the eyes of your heart will have enough light to see what is the hope of God's call, what is the richness of God's glorious inheritance among believers, and what is the overwhelming greatness of God's power that is working among us believers. This power is conferred by the energy of God's powerful strength." - Ephesians 1:17-19

This is the prayer I have for us in the new year -- that we would have a spirit of wisdom that makes God known to us, that we will see through the eyes of our heart where the light of God is calling us.

May God bless you with eyes to see where God is calling.

And may God always give us the courage and wisdom to follow.
