My family wasn't very church-y growing up. My parents took me to Sunday School because it's what you did. I was baptized when I was 12 before confirmation started because if I was going to affirm my baptism, I first needed to have a baptism to affirm.

I got involved in church when I was in high school, after I was confirmed, when a woman named Kim reached out to ask me to join a youth group she was putting together at our church. I didn't have a good reason not to, so I said yes.

Even through all of my wandering and lukewarm engagement, I never felt that God was far from me. Even though I wasn't baptized until I was 12, I didn't feel God being *more* present with me after that. God was just as close to me at 12 as at 11 or 8 or 4.

Because, as Lutherans, what we celebrate at baptism is GOD'S action rather than our own. And God has continually been the one acting throughout my life. My hunch is as you look back through your life, this is the case with you as well.

This week in Scripture, we'll hear three short stories all tied together by God's presence. They come from Mark's gospel and Mark doesn't beat around the bush with a lot of details. Mark gets right to the point.

Within six verses, Jesus is baptized, driven into the wilderness to be tempted by Satan, and then comes back into Galilee to announce the Good News that God's reign has come near.

That's a rollercoaster of a ride in six short verses!

And the common thread between them all is the presence and guidance of God the entire way through these foundational events in the ministry of Jesus.

As we begin our season of Lent, we're tired.

We're in month 11 of a pandemic that just won't guit.

We're coming out of a brutal cold snap that wears anyone down.

We're so tired of the division and the fighting in our country and we just want it to stop.

If it feels like it's hard right now it's because it is hard right now.

But we move into the season of Lent ready to sense God's presence with us through every peak and valley. We're ready to see what God has in store for us. We're ready to see again and again how God continues to show up in our community and in the world.

Again and again we need God. Again and again God shows up.
