A couple years ago my family went to Disney on Ice in Fargo. Lily was 4 at the time and we got her dressed up in her favorite Elsa costume, made sure her tiara was straight, and walked into the Fargo-dome.
I still remember her face as we walked from the concourse through the tunnel to get a full view of the ice and all of the props and castle sets that were around. Her eyes were as big as saucers. It was almost like she wasn't walking, but was being magnetically drawn into this experience of enchant-ment.
Have you ever had that kind of experience?
That kind of experience where something in front of you has drawn you in so deeply that you lose track of yourself?
I've been thinking about these experiences this week because of what Jesus says in our gospel lesson for this coming Sunday.
We jump forward in our reading of John to Palm Sunday. Jesus has just entered Jerusalem in the palm procession/protest march and he goes to the temple to foretell his death on the cross yet again.
The words he uses are telling and important for what happens on the cross.
Verses 31-33 read: Now is the time for judgment of this world. Now this world's ruler will be thrown out. When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to me." (He said this to show how he was going to die.)
This world's ruler will be overthrown. When Jesus is lifted high on the cross, he will draw everyone to himself in love.
Sometimes the things that draw us in are harmless like fascination with Disney on Ice or perhaps a beautiful sunrise or sunset. But some things draw us in and are harmful prejudice, mistrust, anger, greed, pride. These are all seductive things that can draw us in.
But those things all belong to this world. And <b>when Jesus is lifted high on the cross, he overthrows</b> their power and draws us instead to him in love.
As we draw closer to Palm Sunday and the week set apart to remember this story of God's power over sin and death, we turn our attention to the cross.
Because it's on that cross that our savior overthrows the power of sin and death and draws all of crea- tion to him in love.
May God overthrow the sin and death alive in our hearts and our communities. May God continually call us out of those places of despair into hope. May God grant us the strength and wisdom to be drawn to him in love.
