"Holy Father, watch over them in your name, the name you gave me, that they will be one just as we are one." - John 17:11

In the reading for this Sunday, Jesus is spending some of his last moments before being arrested in prayer. It's fascinating to listen to Jesus praying, isn't it? It's an intimate moment of communication between Parent and Son.

Of all the things that Jesus could have prayed for, this is what he chose: that God's people would be one.

Jesus could have prayed for Christianity to conquer all. He could have asked God to send plagues on Rome to save him from the cross. He could have prayed for anything to happen and God would have done it.

Instead, Jesus prayed that God's people would be one, that we would be united in the name of Jesus.

According to a recent Google search, there are over 45,000 Christian denominations globally. Even within denominations, there are ideological differences. Within individual congregations, there can be conflict and disunity.

Jesus knew this, because he knew that he was praying for humans. We have a well-documented history of making a mess out of things. And yet Jesus persists in praying for unity among us.

Jesus prayed for you. Isn't that remarkable? Jesus prayed for Our Saviour's. Jesus prayed for Balsamlund.

He prayed for every one of his followers, that we would focus less on being correct and more on being one. In our best moments, this prayer comes true in our communities.

In our worst moments, we can cause a lot of hurt.

And yet his prayer still persists. His prayer hits us new again each day. He prays that we would be one as we were baptized into one church, one body, one faith.

It's our prayer today as well -- that wherever conflict divides, Jesus would heal.

Lord, pour out your Holy Spirit on your people today. Help us to live with humility, mercy, and love. And make us one as only you can. Amen.
