"When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf." - John 15:26

In this part of John's gospel, he's telling his disciples about what will happen after the resurrection and ascension -- essentially what will happen after Jesus is no longer physically with them. He talks about an Advocate, a Spirit of truth, who will join the disciples in their ministry and accompany them as advocates often do.

This Sunday in the church we celebrate Pentecost Sunday when this in-breaking actually happens. On that first Pentecost, the disciples were gathered together in a room and were waiting. They were unsure of where to go and what to do. They knew Jesus had promised to be with them, but they had just seen him ascend to the Father.

How could God be with them and also apart from them?

God's answer is recorded in Acts 2. It speaks of a rather chaotic scene.

They're gathered together and waiting. All of a sudden a rush of wind blows through the house. Tongues of fire ignite over the heads of each person. Everyone begins to testify - to tell the story of how Jesus has impacted their lives. Here's the wild thing: they're all speaking different languages. And even though they're speaking different languages, they understand each other. They receive the testimony from one another in faith and understanding in a way that communicates the presence of the Holy Spirit in uncertain times.

It can be difficult to live in uncertain times, can't it?

It can be difficult to summon the faith to gather in a space and not know what is going to happen. Sure God promised to be present, but what will that presence look like? What will it feel like? What response will it provoke in us or demand of us?

And yet isn't this what we do everyday?

We go about our day not knowing what lies ahead of us. We can plan out every minute of every hour, but the Holy Spirit can still have a way of interrupting even the best laid plans.

One of the most encouraging things for me about Pentecost is the assurance that the Holy Spirit is present, and even works best, in situations that look chaotic to us.

Where we see chaos, the Holy Spirit sees potential.

My prayer for us as we sit on the edge of so many unknowns is that we can summon the faith to sit together in these rooms like they did on the first Pentecost and wait for God to move. It's not easy. We want answers and results on our timeline. But that's not how God works.

But even in the midst of the unknowns and uncertainties, God's Spirit is still moving.

God is still with us.

God is still making all things new.

Thanks be to God.
