In last week's devotion, we highlighted the Hebrew word "tov," which means "good, life-giving, whole." It's the word used in the creation stories when God speaks creation to existence and calls things "good."

Pastor Scot McKnight, in his book A Church Called Tov has outlined 7 traits of communities that operate with tov -- or goodness -- as their center. Over the next seven weeks, we'll use this space to dive a little deeper into each one.

This is week 1: Nurturing empathy.

Communities that operate out of a spirit of God's goodness nurture empathy.

What does this look like?

In Jesus's first sermon in the Gospel of Luke, he walks to the front of room, unrolls a scroll from the prophet Isaiah and reads the following:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of God's favor.

We don't know all the details, but we know that Jesus always had his eye on those who were cast out or wounded by society.

The heart of Jesus' mission is to bring good news and redemption to those who are wounded, neglected, ignored, abused, lost, and violated. He sees them because he sees with the eyes of God. He suffers with them. He looks on them with compassion and continues to eat with them, pray with them, heal them, and restore them to society.

When we nurture empathy, feeling what someone else is feeling or entering the experience of another, we live faithfully into the call of Christ - the call to come and follow.

Who are the people who are wounded or neglected in our midst?

How can we step out of our own feelings and enter the experience of another person?

How can we preach the gospel into their lives, using words only when absolutely necessary?

These are some of the questions we ask in this first week of moving toward tov, while we nurture empathy in our hearts, homes, and community.
