Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:4-7

This encouragement from the Apostle Paul at the end of his letter to the church in Philippi has been a buoying presence this past month and I wanted to share it with you in hopes it can encourage you as well.

The encouragement for me comes particularly when we look at this passage in reverse order. Paul ends by talking about the peace of God, which surpasses understanding, guarding our hearts and minds.

We don't often think of peace as a guard.

Often times peace is seen as the reward or the end result of resisting temptation or dealing with conflict. But Paul tells the church that peace is actually a guard of our hearts and minds.

How do we access this peace? Let's keep going.

"... in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God."

This is where the rubber hits the road.

We are able to receive the peace that comes from Jesus when we bring two things to God:

- 1) by prayer, asking God to provide those things that we may lack
- 2) by prayer, giving thanks for all that God has already given us.

It is through prayer, particularly prayer that asks for God to provide and gives thanks to God for all that has been provided for us, that we are able to access this peace, which guards our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Once we sense this peace as a part of our lives, connected to God in prayer and thanksgiving, what more is there to do than rejoice?

My prayer for us this week is that we are able to give thanks, connect to God in prayer, and be filled with the peace of God, which guards our hearts and minds in Christ.
