As we begin a new month, we head into a season of gratitude -- of giving thanks for the blessings that have been given to us. It can often be seen as a ramp-up to Christmas of sorts, where we look with joy and anticipation at the holiday season ahead.

However, if you're like me, maybe you need a minute to breathe before we talk about "ramping" anything up.

A minute to rest.

A minute to breathe.

A minute to get your bearings.

A few weeks back, my family was in COVID quarantine. Megan and I were both just worn down and fatigued. Our kids were entirely unphased by the virus. They were running at normal, warp speed; Megan and I were running at something less than that.

Sitting side-by-side in chairs under blankets we gave ourselves the time and space to name all the crappy things about that situation. We named it all. We named the exhaustion and the confusion and all of the mucky stuff we were feeling.

Then we seemed to reach the bottom.

And we seemed to naturally float back up. We started naming things we were grateful for: that the kids weren't sick, that we didn't have more severe symptoms, that we had chairs to sit in and blankets to keep us warm, that we had food in our refrigerator and more coming to our front door via the generosity of friends and neighbors.

There was a lot of gratitude to share, even though we felt pretty crummy.

As we come up on All Saints weekend, and the beginning of the turn toward Thanksgiving, we can name wherever we are in that litany. You may be at a point where you need to name the hard things going on. You may be in a place to celebrate the joy and resilience you've found this season.

This All Saints Day, we bring everything we have to God. We bring our grief and our sorrows. We bring our blessings and our joys. We give thanks, and we ask for God's mercy. All at the same time.

Wherever you are on this journey, know that God sees you and loves you. God will never leave you nor forsake you.

And that is something for which all of us can give thanks.
