## What does it mean to pray for God's kingdom to be near?

When Jesus taught his disciples to pray, one of the first actions or moves for which we pray is for God's kingdom to come near us.

This is the opposite direction that most of us are used to thinking about when we think about the kingdom of God. We grew up learning that the kingdom of God was somewhere *out there* or *up there* or somehow someplace else.

For so long, we've been taught that God's kingdom is a place that exists outside of our world where we go if we are good enough for God. Sound familiar?

Yet whenever Jesus taught about the kingdom of God, he used such earthly things.

A mustard seed.

A father who had two sons.

A gardener spreading seeds on the ground.

A shepherd who has 99 out of 100 sheep.

The kingdom of God is mentioned over 80 times in the New Testament. Jesus is constantly talking about what God's kingdom looks like and he uses these earthly examples for a reason.

Jesus invites us to pray for God's kingdom to come because the grace, mercy, and love that are fully present in God's kingdom can be glimpsed here and now. We pray for God's kingdom to come near so that those things can be seen and made real here in our midst.

Where is the kingdom of God in our world?

It's where we reach for mercy instead of punishment.

It's where we reach for restoration instead of outrage.

This is how God's kingdom is made real among us.

When we pray for this, we fix our attention on the things that bring mercy and restoration to us and to our community. That's what God's kingdom looks like when it shows up among us.
