This week at OSLC, we celebrate with our 9th grade families as seven of our young people affirm their baptism in worship. This is always such a powerful milestone because we, as a congregation, affirm what the Holy Spirit is doing in their lives, and we also give space for them to take ownership and responsibility of the baptismal promises that were made on their behalf at baptism.

In the Lutheran church, we believe that God is the primary actor in baptism. This was key to Martin Luther's understanding of baptism and what differentiates us from a lot of other Christian traditions. Some churches do dedications or consecrations of newborns and then do baptisms when the youth are in their early teens.

Since we believe baptism is primarily to do with God and God's promises, we baptize anyone who expresses desire for themselves or their child(ren) to be baptized.

The milestone we call Affirmation of Baptism (or Confirmation) is when the young people take those promises on for themselves. In our Affirmation liturgy, there are 5 promises that young people take on. They're good reminders for us as well, about our call to discipleship and our vocation as baptized Christians. Here they are:

- to live among God's faithful people,
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

One of the things I tell our 9th graders often is that we spend the rest of our lives seeking these out. By affirming our baptism, it doesn't mean we're experts at all of these things or that we'll never make mistakes. Far from it!

It only means that we are committing to using these acts of faith as our guide for our lives. And when we fall away from them (and that's a *when*, not an if), we commit to doing what we can to turning and returning to this life of faith.

They're great promises for us to examine every so often too. Because these are promises we made once upon a time. These promises are a good lantern to guide us through the wilderness shining the light of Christ to illuminate the way ahead.

We continue to pray for our young people and their families as they celebrate this wonderful milestone. And that we may align ourselves with these promises in our lives of faith as well.
